	Bangladesh Red Crescent Society	Youth use drama to publicize the cyclone warning system, which reaches 8 million people in coastal communities. 	Cambodian Red Cross Society	Flood early warning system in three provinces. Local community members and RC volunteers take daily water-level measurements and set up a system of community notice boards indicating when flooding was likely. Water-level measurements relayed to the Mekong River Commission, which monitors river flow and sends additional early warning to communities further downstream via radio networks. http://www.redcross.org.kh/english/index.asp

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Asia Pacific	Indian Red Cross Society	<p>In Orissa, following a devastating cyclone, 23 multi-purpose cyclone shelters were constructed with support from German RC and the German government. Shelter maintenance task forces and disaster management committees at shelter level learned shelter use and maintenance. Mass rallies and drills, posters and manuals provided cyclone evacuation education for the public. Additional support came from the IFRC, Spanish, American and British RC partners. 	Viet Nam Red Cross Society	<p>Micro-projects supported by Netherlands RC have ranged from building dams to improving local early warning systems and improving roads or bridges for faster evacuation. Its main slogan, “Drop, Cover and Hold On”, is supplemented by a changing annual theme. 	Uruguayan Red Cross	<p>The Santa Rosa branch No Bag in the Middle campaign is strengthened by partnerships with local government, the Ministry of Health and environmental coalitions. 	Tuvalu Red Cross Society	A two-week campaign, culminating on World Environment Day, raised awareness of climate-change impacts. Global	IFRC	Vulnerability and capacity assessment (VCA) guidance materials include: What is VCA?, How to do a VCA, VCA Training Guide, VCA Tool Box, VCA Lessons Learned. The standard toolkit includes the following activities, which have been well tested in rural communities: analysing secondary and external sources, sampling, questionnaires, interviews, focus groups, historical timeline, mapping, seasonal calendar, institutional network analysis, direct observation, transect walk, problem tree and Venn diagrams. 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Americas	American Red Cross	VCA tools have been reinterpreted with a focus on local institutional level-intervention. The new Ready Rating programme first invites participating chapters to carry out their own disaster readiness assessment (scorecard) to look at their worst-case scenario. Africa	Mozambique Red Cross Society	In the very poorest communities, the most essential and missing tool for dependable access to disaster prevention information is a wind-up and solar-powered radio designed to withstand dust, water and harsh temperatures. Volunteers wearing and selling T-shirts and caps, and banners add to the ambience. Risk mapping, evacuation planning and community disaster management planning have all been successfully introduced through these events, with little effort needed to negotiate and arrange. Americas	Central America Region	The <i>Safe Schools</i> training manual and School Maintenance guidelines were adapted and developed from the experience of the Organization of American States (OAS), supported by ProVention Consortium. Safe Schools uses a visually appealing illustrated workbook format to engage students and staff in identifying hazards and vulnerabilities, transforming these into capacities, coming up with solutions and action plans, school site mapping, evacuation planning, response planning and provisions. 	American Red Cross	<i>Red Cross Ready Rating Program</i> , an emergency preparedness process for schools provides support for institutional partnerships, taking schools through the following five steps: join and commit to steady improvement each year, conduct a hazard vulnerability assessment, develop an emergency response plan, implement emergency response plan, and help your community get prepared. http://www.readyrating.org/

MENA	Syrian Arab Red Crescent	<p>Developed a road safety campaign for fourth graders, based on drills. Children are drilled in an area of 300 square metres to learn traffic safety and first aid.
